

SNPs and dating of SNP formation

Each box indicates the SNP or SNPs (in bold) carried by the lines of descent enclosed. The brackets indicate the range of dates within which the SNP was formed. Note that SNPs continue unchanged beyond their formation date.

L744, L745, L746 Descendants of Walter FitzAlan (ca 1110-1177) carry these SNPs but they pre-date this time

Z38845 Indicates descent from King Robert II

ZZ52_1 and FT223221 Indicate descent from King Robert III. Not all of his male line descendants will necessarily test positive for these SNPs

BY56425 Indicates descent from Sir John Stewart of Blackhall and Ardgowan. It is quite likely that this SNP was not formed until around 1635 or later, but further confirmation is required. Not all of his male line descendants will necessarily test positive for this SNP

BY184394 Indicates descent from Robert Stewart, Duke of Albany (1340-1420). Not all of his male line descendants will necessarily test positive for this SNP

FT183853 Indicates descent from Murdoch Stewart, 2nd Duke of Albany (1362-1425). Not all of his male line descendants will necessarily test positive for this SNP

Z17582 indicates descent from Alexander Stewart, Earl of Buchan 'The Wolf of Badenoch'. Not all of his male line descendants will necessarily test positive for this SNP

FTT46 Indicates descent from Sir John Stewart, Sheriff of Bute. Not all of his male line descendants will necessarily test positive for this SNP

Y14197 Indicates descent from William Stewart of Fennoch. Not all of his male line descendants will necessarily test positive for this SNP

Y14198 Indicates descent from James Stewart (d 1477), son of William Stewart of Fennoch. Not all of his male line descendants will necessarily test positive for this SNP

S781 Indicates descent from Sir John Stewart of Bonkyl

So far over 100 male line descendants of Walter Stewart, 6th High Steward, have been identified
